The ASR includes detailed information about crime statistics on our campus and security policies and procedures that are in place to ensure the well-being of students, faculty, and staff.

We encourage all members of our community to review the ASR carefully and familiarize themselves with the information contained within it. The safety and well-being of our students, faculty, and staff are our top priorities, and we remain committed to providing a safe and secure environment for everyone on our campus.

3. Legal sanctions may also be imposed for unlawful drug or alcohol activities, including fines and imprisonment.
