Multimodal Scholarship Series March 23rd, 12:30 pm - 2:30 pm



Join DFI for a special guest multimodal presentation from researcher Kyle Oliver! This event will take place in the DFI Mixed Use Space (RH 509).

The use of audio data in both the analysis and reporting stages of ethnographic research offers distinct epistemological and ethical benefits to researchers, participants, and audience. Drawing on scenes from Becoming Tapestry, the dissertation podcast chronicling Kyle's participatory ethnographic investigation of a West Coast foster youth mentoring ministry, he argues for the value of recording and sharing sound in multimodal scholarship.
