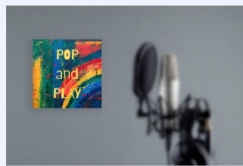

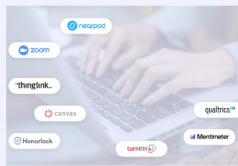

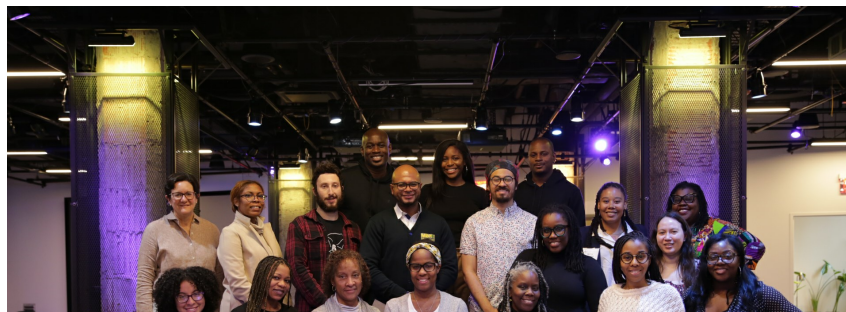

Smith Learning Theater Possibilities

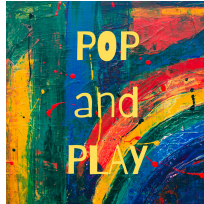
June 7, 12:00 - 1:00pm | In-Person
