

DFI welcomes the TC community to "The Privilege of Play: Connecting Games and Race in the 20th Century", a talk by Aaron Trammell, Associate Professor of Informatics at UC Irvine.



ABOUT THE TALK:

Race has been central to the history of games. Dr. Trammell will present historical research that shows how the early leaders of the game industry were able to thrive due to their community ties. He terms these white communities "networks of privilege" and offers evidence for how these networks developed during the course of the 20th century and used dog whistles to keep BIPOC people out. Dr. Trammell will foreground how the invisible politics of whiteness have shaped the history of games itself.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER:

Dr. Aaron Trammell is interested in how tabletop games further values of white privilege and hegemonic masculinity in geek culture. He is the Editor-in-Chief of the journal Analog Game Studies, Multimedia Editor at Sounding Out! and the co-editor for the Tabletop Gaming series at University of Michigan Press. His books include Repairing Play, The Privilege of Play, and Designing Dragons: Quantifying Fantasy in Dungeons & Dragons (available late 2025).
