
3. Al in 30 Minutes: A Beginner's Series



For example, increased data center construction and use is forecasted to represent up to 12.0% of total U.S. electricity consumption by 2028. Despite these alarming trends, AI seems to remain on the rise across domains. The talk provides a summary of how AI affects the environment and proposes an educational framework that emphasizes interactive and collaborative learning designs.
